Update on NEU Teacher Strike Action

Following our previous communication regarding the National Education Union (NEU) announcement of national and regional strike action in England, I am writing to update you on the situation at Winslow CE School for **Wednesday 1**st **March 2023**.

We are able to keep the **school open for all pupils on Wednesday 1**st **March** and maintain the safety of pupils and staff. Should the situation change, we will of course let you know at the earliest opportunity.

We will provide further updates in due course on the further planned strikes for the 15th and 16th March. We thank you for your continued understanding and support at this difficult time.

Attendance

At Winslow CE School we place great importance on good attendance and punctuality.

We know that a child's attendance has a direct impact on their learning. Those children who are regularly absent from school and regularly late do not achieve their potential and do fall behind in class. Please support the school in this by ensuring that your child attends school regularly and arrives ready to learn and on time at 8.40am.

Attendance really does matter and it is important that your child gets to school on time and aims for 100% attendance. Frequent absence can add up to a considerable amount of lost learning and can seriously disadvantage your child in adult life.


The chart below identifies the possible amount of lost learning due to poor attendance. How does your child compare?

Attendance during the	Equals this number of	Which is approximately
school year	days absent	this many weeks absent
90%	19 days	4 weeks
80%	38 days	8 weeks
70%	57 days	11.5 weeks

Nationally primary pupil attendance is around 96%. This means that a child needs to attend school for at least 177 out of 190 days (no more than 7 days absence across the whole year) to meet national expectations.

Punctuality

It is very important that all children arrive on time. Classroom doors open between 8:40am and 8:50am. It can be unsettling for children who are regularly late and missing valuable lesson time. Children that do arrive late to school need to enter through the main entrance. It is very important for safety reasons that you accompany them and report to the school office. Registers are closed at 9:00am and a late book entry must be completed for every late child after this time.



Please work with us to provide your child with the best chances of learning by ensuring they are in school every day and on time. Thank you.

The Healthy Start Scheme - Get help to buy food and milk

If you're more than 10 weeks pregnant or have a child under 4, you may be entitled to get help to buy healthy food and milk. If you're eligible, you'll be sent a Healthy Start card with money on it that you can use in some UK shops.

You can use your card to buy:

- plain liquid cow's milk
- fresh, frozen, and tinned fruit and vegetables
- fresh, dried, and tinned pulses
- · infant formula milk based on cow's milk

You can also use your card to collect:

- Healthy Start vitamins these support you during pregnancy and breastfeeding
- vitamin drops for babies and young children these are suitable from birth to 4 years old
