Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been another week full of exciting learning opportunities at Winslow School. Year Five have had a particularly busy week with a visit from Science Oxford on Tuesday. The children experienced a pop-up planetarium and a space-themed workshop. The children spent the day as space recruits, carrying out astronaut tasks and learning about space. Back in the classroom, they undertook astronaut training, tackling space tasks wearing big gloves and making chocolate pudding space food! In the afternoon, their workshop was based on rocket cars, using plastic bottles to design cars and launched them across the playground using water and compressed air.

Across the school we have been celebrating World Book Day and it was wonderful to see so many staff and children dressed up as book characters on Thursday. The children participated in a wide variety of activities to promote reading for pleasure in their classrooms and enjoyed coming together for a whole school collective worship to hear a retelling of Julia Donaldson's 'The Scarecrows' Wedding' by different members of staff.





In the afternoon the whole school met on the playground for an opportunity to celebrate reading for pleasure outside. Reading for pleasure is the single biggest indicator of a child's future success – more than their family circumstances, their parents' educational background or their income. We want to develop a life-long habit of reading for pleasure and today all of the children have today received a World Book Day book token which can be redeemed at many participating retailers for a special World Book Day book or a discount on any children's book.

The theme for the day was 'Find your reading superpower?' and children were invited to enter a competition. Book prizes for the lucky winners have been provided by Buckingham Book Shop.

Fresh Start also got involved in the celebrations with two lucky children finding 'Golden Tickets' in their puddings. Congratulations to Henry in Reception and Oliver in Year 4 for winning special books prizes.

On Tuesday, this week the two Reception classes made a visit to the Town library in Winslow. The children had a busy visit with lots of different activities to do. They were amazed to discover that the library has over 6,100 books and that they could borrow 20 books at a time. The children are keen to revisit the library with their parents and get a library card of their own.

They also had a story time and looked at the books on offer in the children's section of the library.

At the end of the visit the children were all given their own copy of the book 'I really, really need a wee!' by Mike Newson. The children got to listen to a live online story session with the author on Wednesday where he read his book to them.





The Internet Safety Information Evening held on Tuesday evening and led by Alison Watts, a trained CEOP Ambassador, was a really useful session. I have attached an information leaflet to this Newsletter with some suitable links to help parents support children to manage the online world safely.
