### **Head lice**

It has been brought to our attention that some parents have found it necessary to treat their children for head lice. Head lice are a normal part of childhood —with as many as one in ten children experiencing head lice at any time. Although anyone can get head lice, they are particularly common amongst children of primary school age, who spend more time in close contact with



their friends. So, you need to be vigilant and check your child's hair regularly, ideally once every week. The best-known symptom is itching, but not all children will itch at first so don't rely on this. Leaving lice untreated can be a cause of distraction and irritation for children. The good news is that you can deal with head lice quickly and easily if you take the right action. See the Link below for advice on treatment. Once a week, take a peek
