#### **E Scooters**

It has been brought to our attention by members of the community that some of our parents are using e-scooters to drop their children off at school. I would like to take this opportunity to raise awareness of e-scooters and the law and ensure the safety for all of our community.

- It is illegal to ride a privately owned e-scooter in public spaces.
- Privately owned e-scooters are only allowed to be 'driven' on roads by an adult with a licence, insurance and tax for the e-scooter. They should never be taken on pathways, cycle ways or bridleways for risk to other users.
- Only one individual is permitted to ride an e-scooter at a time, there should be no 'passengers'.
