The children were keen to hear about her incredible experiences and enjoyed seeing photographs and listening to the stories about life at school, healthcare, food, weather, children and families. This led to some thoughtful reflections about how the people have very little but are very happy. Vron plans to visit Malawi again next year and we look forward to hearing more about her time there.

## What is Accelerated Reader?

When children have finished the reading schemes, they become 'library readers' and are allowed to borrow two books. At this stage they will start to use 'Accelerated Reader' to help them choose a book. When they have read it they will complete a quiz to check that they have understood it.

Children who use Accelerated Reader (mostly Y2 upwards) can now do their quizzes at home. Please use this link: <u>Accelerated Reader Quiz</u> Children login using their first initial and first four letters of their surname as their username and their library number as their password.

# Tips for using Accelerated Reader at home

In addition to books from school, many books you have at home may have quizzes available, just type the title of the book into the quiz search box. Children can also do vocabulary quizzes, and quizzes on the articles available on the Accelerated Reader website.
