Meanwhile our oldest children in Year Six have been finding out more about Mr McConnell's culture. They made champ, a potato and spring onion dish, played Gaelic football and learnt about the Irish language.

Parents were able to enjoy reading with their children before watching the class teachers lead a phonics session using our Little Wandle Phonics programme. We are looking forward to welcoming Reception parents into school next week for their 'Stay and Read' session and are planning a further reading information session for parents later this term.

Next week we will begin our Harvest celebrations. Reverend Stephen from St Laurence Church will lead a thanksgiving Collective Worship for the children on Monday. We plan to create baskets of donations from the children to be delivered to our local senior citizens in the bungalows and flats in Lowndes Way and Scott Evans Court, and to Swan House Care Home. #### Why is good attendance so important?

Even taking a short amount of time off school can have a significant negative impact upon a child's educational fulfilment and further education. Your child might fall behind in their learning and not be able to catch up. If there are gaps in their knowledge they will find school assessment time more difficult. There could be other difficulties too; children who miss school are missing out on social interaction which affects their ability to make friends and it can affect their confidence to attempt new work and work alongside others.
