- 4. **U** Use firm talk (no shouting).
- 5. G Get adult help.

Chess News from Mr McClellan



Current members of the Chess Club will soon have completed the "Introduction to Chess" course and will have been taught the basics of the game.

Children who re-join the club next term will be entered for the first stage the Delancey U.K. Chess Challenge and will play a series of seven competitive games in school. All children will win prizes as they progress through these games and the overall winner receives a trophy. There is no charge for entry to this stage of the competition, as the fee is payed from Chess Club subscriptions.

Children who are really keen on chess may choose to take part in the second stage, the Megafinals, which take place in April and May and give them the chance to compete against children from other schools. Entry does require an additional fee which is paid directly to the organisers.

The Gigafinals and Tetrafinals take place later in the year where the standard of play becomes much higher.

Attendance

Well done to 2AA who had the best whole class average attendance this week with 97.32%. Our average whole school attendance this week is 94.94%.

Persistent Absence

Persistent absence is defined by the Government as attendance that is below 90%. This equates to 19 days or more absence a year. Research clearly shows that poor attendance leads to poor educational outcomes. This could also result in the authority taking legal action against parents, resulting in a fine or court appearance.

What is Accelerated Reader?

When children have finished the reading schemes, they become 'library readers' and are allowed to borrow two books. At this stage they will start to use 'Accelerated Reader' to help them choose a book. When they have read it they will complete a quiz to check that they have understood it.

Children who use Accelerated Reader (mostly Y2 upwards) can now do their quizzes at home. Please use this link: <u>Accelerated Reader Quiz</u> Children login using their first initial and first four letters of their surname as their username and their library number as their password.

Tips for using Accelerated Reader at home

In addition to books from school, many books you have at home may have quizzes available, just type the title of the book into the quiz search box. Children can also do vocabulary quizzes, and quizzes on the articles available on the Accelerated Reader website.
