#### **Books and water bottles**

Please make sure that our precious library books and reading books don't come into contact with water bottles. In particular the Air Up bottles seem to be causing a lot of damage. Children in Early Years and KS1 should have a book bag in which to carry picture books and reading books safely – rucksacks are not suitable for picture books as the books get bent. Water bottles should not be put into book bags.

Older children who borrow chapter books, should be able to carry them safely in a rucksack, but will need to make sure that they are in a separate compartment from water bottles.

In the last week, six books have been ruined by water, we will therefore need to charge for damaged books.

#### **Rainbows Pre-School and Starting School in September 2024**

If your child was born between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2019 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2020 you can now apply for a school place at <u>Buckinghamshire School Admissions</u>. If you would like a place for child in Reception in September 2024, you must apply for a place, even if your child is at currently attending Rainbows Pre-school.

The application deadline is 15<sup>th</sup> January 2024 - please do not miss it.

#### Parking

Please can I remind parents and carers to park considerately on the roads surrounding the school. Please remember not to block driveways or roads and park as far away from the school as possible. It is important that in the event of an emergency, vehicles such as fire engines and ambulances are able to gain access without parked cars blocking entrance routes. It is also important that our children have a safe walking route to school so please do not park on pavements or footpaths. Thank you for your support with this.
