Dear Parents and Carers,

On Tuesday it was Safer Internet Day. Established by the UK Safer Internet Centre (UKSIC), Safer Internet Day is celebrated around the world and this year the theme was '**Inspiring**

change? Making a difference, managing influence and navigating change online'.

This week, we have been celebrating Safer Internet Day by completing age-appropriate activities in class relating to staying safe online and making the best out of modern technologies - while also being mindful of the potential risks and how to deal with these should they arise. As well as this, this week's Computing lessons have been internet safety focused, with Early Years and KS1 listening and reacting to stories involving characters dealing with technology, while KS2 have been invited to play interactive games which explore the digital world and help build children's confidence while using the internet.

Safer Internet Day provides us with a great opportunity to have a conversation with our children about their online lives as well as provide us with an opportunity to brush up on our own knowledge of all things online with lots of resources and online activities available.

These top tips have been written for parents and carers to help you support your child to stay safe and happy online.

- Inspire change by modelling how to be safe online
 Just like in their offline lives, children need role models online too. Set clear and fair expectations about how the whole family should use the internet and technology, and demonstrate these yourself.
- Make a difference by having regular discussions about the online world
 Having regular and open conversations with your child about their use of technology and
 the internet is the best way to stay up to date, not only with changes in the online world,
 but also with what they are doing and seeing online.
- Manage influence by researching the content and games your child enjoys the
 most
 Giving young people the opportunity to talk about their life online, and enjoying online
 content together, can be a great way to gain an insight into the content they are viewing.
- Navigate change by knowing where to go for further support
 If your child needs help, it's important you know where to go for further support. Using
 the report and block buttons, websites such as 'Report Harmful Content', and other

safety tools is a great starting point. It can also help to talk to other parents and carers who may have experienced something similar.

On Wednesday we were delighted to invite parents and carers from Reception and Key Stage One to a '*Maths Stay and Play*' session. We hope this provided a snapshot of how we teach maths, even if the session was cut short by an evacuation due to the alarm being unexpectedly activated! Thank you for your patience and understanding while we followed our fire safety procedures and ensured that all visitors, adults and children were accounted for. I hope this didn't cause too many of you to be late for work or other appointments and appreciate your understanding.

We are looking forward to seeing you this afternoon, between 2:45 and 4:00pm, for our Art Exhibition in the school hall. Please come along before or after collecting your child at the end of the day and thank you in advance for your support with this.

I hope you have a wonderful half-term and look forward to seeing you all on Monday 19th February, when the children return to school.
